Session 6 ~ When Impatience Drives Our Decisions

1 Samuel 8:19-22; 10:8; 13:8-14; 15:22

The Israelites begged the prophet, Samuel, for a king like other nations, one who would lead them into battle. But God's plan for Israelite kingship was unique: the LORD would be the Great King with the human king as vice-regent and the prophet as God's spokesman. The people wanted God's power but not his control. Waiting on God was difficult, and King Saul, to his detriment, let his impatience drive his decisions.

Samuel instructed Saul to wait seven days in Gilgal until the prophet came to offer pre-battle sacrifices.

But when Samuel didn't arrive at the expected time, Saul panicked.
