## Session 9 ~ When the Green-Eyed Monster Attacks

William Shakespeare coined the phrase "the green-eyed monster" to describe the damaging effect
of jealousy. English uses "jealousy" and "envy" interchangeably despite their different meanings
However, jealousy is the fear someone will take what's ours; envy is a desire for what someon
has. And covetousness is a desire to take what someone has, leaving them empty-handed.

Consequences of jealousy, envy, and covetousness:

Anger is cruel and fury overwhelming, but who can stand before jealousy? (Proverbs 27:4
A heart at peace gives life to the body, but envy rots the bones. (Proverbs 14:30)
You covet but you cannot get what you want, so you quarrel and fight. (James 4:2)
For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. (Matthew 6:21)

Jealousy, envy, and covetousness in the Bible lead to honor competitions:

• Cain and Abel (Genesis 4:1-16)

- Jacob and Esau (*Genesis 25:19-34; 27:1-45*)
- Rachel and Leah (*Genesis 29:15-35; 30:1-24*)
- Joseph and his brothers (*Genesis 37*)
- David and Saul (1 Samuel 15—31)
- Ananias and Sapphira (*Acts 4:32—5:11*)

Cure for jealousy, envy, and covetousness:

Everyone who confesses the name of the Lord must turn away from wickedness. (2 Timothy 2:19)

Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things. (Colossians 3:2)

I have learned to be content whatever the circumstances.... I can do all this through him who gives me strength. (Philippians 4:11, 13)
